Minutes of the Region 22 Board Meeting August 27, 2010

I. The Region 22 Board Meeting was called to order by RVP Hugh Stout at the Fin & Feather Inn in Gore, Oklahoma. Present were: Jim Bledsoe, Bill Goldsberry, Mike Blake, Louise Carson, Paul W. Gossett, Robert Treadway, Nick Stewart, Mona French and Greer Holland.

II. Minutes from the previous meeting were *approved as printed in the AIS Region 22 Newsletter – Winter 2009*.

III. Treasurer's report from Mary Ann Holman was read by Hugh Stout, and is attached. The beginning balance AO 9/18/2009 was \$8,809.65. Deposits were \$2,962.61 and disbursements were \$3,847.40, with an ending balance of \$7,924.86

Youth Endowment Fund reflected an ending balance of \$2,600.56, with no disbursements and reflected accumulated interest of \$6.97 for the year.

IV. Committees were given as follows:

A. Nick Stewart, Membership Chairman, reported that the current regional AIS membership is 207 with a decrease of 17 members or 4.7% decrease from last year. Total Affiliate no changes. AIS showed a 7.5% decrease in members.

B. Louise Carson gave the Judges Training Report. One judge was dropped from the roster and one move to retired status. There are 2 - Apprentice, 17 - Garden/Exhibition, 15 - Master, 5 - Retired, and 2-Emeritus. Noted judging schools held in Tulsa with Paul Black.

C. Youth – Cynthia Wade no report.

There were no candidates for Region 22 M.D. Faith Youth Achievement Award.

D. Newsletter – Paul W. Gossett gave the Newsletter Report which is attached.

i. Fall, 2009 newsletter cost \$ 993.17 for 300 copies, of which 273 were mailed. The newsletter had 5 double sided pages, and a double sided color cover.

ii. Winter, 2009 newsletter cost \$834.13 for 310 copies, of which 268 were mailed. The newsletter had 9 double sided pages, and a double sided color cover and an additional page for the 2010 AIS Convention Registration form.

iii. Spring, 2010 newsletter cost \$ 1086.58 for 300 copies, of which 267 were mailed. The newsletter had 7 double sided pages, and a double sided color cover and an additional page for the Region 22 Annual Meeting Registration form.

iv. Fall, 2010 newsletter estimated printing costs from various vendors was presented to board with a recommendation.

Proposed a motion to print the Fall 2010 newsletter as scheduled with Premier Printing for October 2010 with estimated cost of \$510 plus estimated mailing cost of \$50.

The Board of Directors supports a motion at the Region 22 meeting to make a change effective with 2011 to start publishing the AIS Region 22 Newsletter via Electronic tools similar to that used by Master Gardener's. This change will require verification Email information for current AIS Region 22 members.

E. Webmaster- Mike Blake reported that the website is updated with information as directed by the RVP.

- III. Treasurer's report from Mary Ann Holman was read by board member. The beginning balance AO 9/18/2009 was \$8,809.65. Deposits were \$2,962.61 and disbursements were \$3,847.40, with an ending balance of \$7,924.86.

Youth Endowment Fund balance is \$2,600.56, with no disbursements and reflected interest of \$6.97 and an ending balance of \$2,607.46.

In the last issue, I wrote about inviting our friends to a meeting, show or other event, as a way to further introduce them to the world of iris.

This time let's consider some of the ways to "get the word out" to our friends, as well as others. Many local newspapers have a calendar of events page, for the weekend, week, or the month. Your listing of the event is usually free, as a community service. Check with your paper's social or styles editor for the proper procedure. When submitting your information, keep it concise, and clearly written or typed. Double check it for accuracy, of date, time, place, and especially the phone numbers!

Once your event date is determined, get a club approved flyer made up and distribute it to your members. Encourage them to make copies and spread them around. Stores often allow a copy to be posted in a "public notice" area, or on a front window. Always ask to do so, and offer to return after the event to remove the flyer. Most places remove such themselves. The flyer can be reduced to 1/2 or 1/4 page copies which can be posted as well as mailed, or handed out. The 1/4 page size is more likely to be put on the 'fridge', as a reminder.

Please use caution and common sense, this fall as we work at preparing our new beds. Plant those iris and get our gardens ready for the winter. Work safely.
